17 AN ACT to Repeal the Nonnegotiability of  
18 Educational Policies.

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
21 follows:

22 26 MRSA §965, sub-§1, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1969,  
23 c. 424, §1, is amended to read:

24 C. To confer and negotiate in good faith with  
25 respect to wages, hours, working conditions and con-  
26 tract grievance arbitration, except that by such ob-  
27 ligation neither party shall be compelled to agree to  
28 a proposal or be required to make a concession and  
29 except that public employers of teachers shall meet  
30 and consult but not negotiate with respect to educa-  
31 tional policies; for the purpose of this paragraph,  
32 educational policies shall not include wages, hours,  
33 working conditions or contract grievance arbitration;

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to provide to teachers employed in public schools the same collective bargaining rights as apply to all other municipal public employees.

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
