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perform the work using its own equipment and personnel on a project estimated to cost more than \$25,000,
the agency shall also indicate how the decision conforms to the policy stated in subsection 1. The list
of proposed improvements is a public record and may
be revised periodically by the agency.

- 3. Records to be kept on projects costing more than \$25,000. Whenever a state agency improves, constructs or makes major repairs or improvements to a public facility with its own equipment or personnel estimated to cost more than \$25,000, the agency shall keep and preserve a full, true and accurate account of the costs of performing the work, including all engineering and administrative expenses and a reasonable estimate of the total cost, including investment cost of equipment used. The final account of the costs shall be a public record.
- 4. Model cost accounting guidelines. On or before December 31, 1985, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, in consultation with informed persons from the public and private sector, shall promulgate model cost accounting guidelines for use by public agencies as required by subsection 3.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to establish a procedure for assuring that improvements, repairs and construction of public facilities, when undertaken by employees of that agency, are made in the least costly way to the State.

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
