18 AN ACT to Make Supplemental Allocations to  
19 the Department of Inland Fisheries and  
20 Wildlife for the Fiscal Years Ending  
21 June 30, 1986, and June 30, 1987.

23 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
24 lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
25 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

26 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-  
27 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

28 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-  
29 dent to the operation of the department will become  
30 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985;  
31 and

32 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,  
33 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of  
34 the Constitution of Maine and require the following  
35 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

1 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
2 therefore,

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
4 follows:

5       Sec. 1. Supplemental Allocation of Inland Fish-  
6 eries and Wildlife Funds. Income to the Department  
7 of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the next 2 fis-  
8 cal years, from July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, and  
9 from July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, shall be segre-  
10 gated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the  
11 following schedule.
