Animal damage control. The coordination of 15 animal damage control functions throughout the State, 16 including supplemental assistance for the control of coyotes and other nuisance wildlife which exceeds 17 18 normal funding and staffing level within the depart-19 ment; 20 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7035, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 21 1979, c. 420, §1, is amended to read: 22 3. Destruction of fish or wildlife. Whenever he deems it necessary for the accomplishment of his statutory duties, the commissioner may, in conjunc-23 24 25 tion with such persons as he may designate to assist him, take and destroy any wildlife. <u>Fursuant to sec-</u> tion 7013, subsection 7-A, the commissioner shall 26 27 28 maintain a coyote control program as follows. 29 A. The commissioner may employ qualified persons 30 to serve as agents of the department for purposes 31 of coyote control. These agents shall be trained 32 by the department in animal damage control techniques and shall be utilized by the department to 33 perform coyote control duties in areas where 34 predation by coyotes is posing a threat to deer 35 36 or other wildlife.  cooperative agreement with the department specifying the conditions and limitations of his responsibilities as an agent, including any terms
for reimbursement of expenses or payment of wages.

- 6 B. Agents shall be trained in the use of snares 7 and shall be deployed in the unorganized town-8 ships to control coyotes during the winter 9 months. All snaring shall be carried out under 10 the direction of department officials and with 11 the knowledge of the local game warden. All ar-12 eas of snaring activity shall be adequately 13 posted.
- 14C. Agents may be utilized for the benefit of ag-15ricultural interests provided that the department16shall be reimbursed annually for the cost of17those efforts by the Department of Agriculture,18Food and Rural Resources from funds specifically19appropriated or otherwise made available to the20Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Re-21sources for that purpose.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment establishes an animal damage control program within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. There is a specific provision for the snaring of coyotes by trained agents in unorganized towns during the winter months. Any costs associated with control of coyotes for the benefit of agricultural interests would be reimbursed by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.

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
