- 1 Open season. Notwithstanding section 7406, 2 subsection 5, there shall be an open season for hunt-3 ing coyotes at night in all counties of the State from January 1st to February 28th March 31st. 4 5 commissioner may terminate this open season at any time in any area if, in his opinion, an immediate 6 7 emergency action is necessary due to adverse weather 8 conditions or illegal hunting activity.
- 9 4. Restrictions. The following restrictions ap-10 ply during the open season for hunting coyotes at 11 night.
- 12 A. All hunting shall be limited to the hours be-13 tween 1/2 hour after before sunset and 9 10 p.m., 14 and to the hours between 4 3 a.m. and 1/2 hour 15 before after sunrise.
- 16 B- All hunting shall be limited to the use of shotguns only.
 - 6. All hunting shall be limited to areas where the ground is completely covered with snow and to ice covered bodies of water.
- 21 D. No person may hunt coyotes at night within 22 100 yards if any motor driven vehicle.
 - E. Any person hunting coyotes at night shall be in possession of an electronic, hand-held or mouth-operated predator calling device.

35 36 There is a bounty of \$15 for every coyote which is killed within the State, to be paid by the Treasurer of State to the person killing the coyote upon compliance with the following conditions. No bounty may be paid unless the claimant, within 10 days after he has killed the animal, exhibits to the warden or warden supervisor in whose district the animal was

killed the entire skin, with the ears, nose and tail in as perfect a state as when killed, except for natural decay, and signs a certificate under oath stating that he killed the animal and the time and place within the State. The certificate shall be approved by and bear the signature of the warden or warden supervisor in whose district the animal was killed, stating that he believes that the coyote was killed at the time and place stated. The warden or warden supervisor shall cut off the entire tail from the skin and destroy the tail. The person claiming the bounty shall forward to the commissioner the claimant's certificate in a form as prescribed by the commissioner. Any claim for a bounty shall be made within 10 days after the killing of the animal.

Upon receipt by the State Controller of a certificate from the commissioner, the controller shall audit the claim for bounty and the bounty shall be paid by the Treasurer of State to the claimant from fines and penalties recovered and money received or collected under any provision of the inland fisheries and wildlife laws, or for sale of any seized or confiscated articles. After those funds have been exhausted, any further bounties shall be paid from the revenues of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

27 STATEMENT OF FACT

28 The purposes of this bill are:

б

- 1. To establish a bounty on coyotes in order to remove a hazard to deer and other animals;
- 2. To establish a \$2 fee for a permit to hunt coyotes at night. The bill also extends the hours for night hunting of coyotes and the coyote hunting season and removes that restriction on coyote hunting; and

3. To require that the funds raised from the sales of supersports licenses be used in the department's Animal Damage Control Program.
