And the privilege of the writ of habeas corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in cases of rebellion or invasion the public safety may require it.

Constitutional referendum procedure; form question; effective date. Resolved: That the aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their spective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended as proposed by a resolution of the Legislature to provide for an express statement of the right to bail and authorizing the denial of bail in certain cases?"

The legal voters of each city, town plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "No." or The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the turns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on date of the proclamation.

4 STATEMENT OF FACT

5 This constitutional resolution amends the Consti-6 tution of Maine, Article I, Section 10, as recommended by the Governor's Commission to Study the Laws 7 Relating to Bail in Criminal Cases. In particular, 8 the resolution expressly recognizes the constitution-al right of every person to "reasonable bail or other 9 10 conditions of release." The resolution also recog-11 nizes the authority to deny bail altogether in cer-12 13 tain situations.
