17 RESOLVE, Concerning State Government
18 Reorganization.

20 Commission to study State Government reorganiza-
21 tion. Resolved: That there is established the Com-
22 mission on State Government Reorganization. The com-
23 mission shall consist of the following members: One
24 Senator, who is a member of the majority political
25 party in the Senate and a member of the Joint Stand-
26 ing Committee on State Government or the Joint Stand-
27 ing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Af-
28 fairs, appointed by the President of the Senate; one
29 Senator, who is a member of the minority political
30 party in the Senate and a member of the Joint Stand-
31 ing Committee on State Government or the Joint Stand-
32 ing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Af-
33 fairs, appointed by the Senate Minority Leader; one
34 member of the House of Representatives, who is a mem-
35 ber of the majority political party in the House of
36 Representatives and a member of the Joint Standing
37 Committee on State Government or the Joint Standing
38 Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs,

1 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representa-
2 tives; one member of the House of Representatives,
3 who is a member of the minority political party in
4 the House of Representatives and a member of the
5 Joint Standing Committee on State Government or the
6 Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Finan-
7 cial Affairs, appointed by the House Minority Leader;
8 2 state career employees appointed by the Governor; 8
9 members from private business appointed by the Gover-
10 nor from among names submitted to the Governor by
11 business organizations throughout the State; and be
12 it further

13 **Duties. Resolved:** That the commission shall in-
14 vestigate possible integration or elimination of
15 state programs, departments and agencies, including,
16 but not limited to, the elimination of duplication in
17 services and programs; and be it further

18 **Report. Resolved:** That the commission shall re-
19 port its findings, together with any implementing
20 legislation, to the First Regular Session of the
21 113th Legislature; and be it further

22 **Compensation. Resolved:** That the members of the
23 commission shall not receive compensation.

24 STATEMENT OF FACT

25 The purpose of this resolve is to establish a
26 commission to study possible integration or elimina-
27 tion of state programs, departments and agencies.

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
