be operated below low water. The operation of the dredge shall not substantially interfere with commercial digging and shall not be used for taking any marine worms, lobsters or other crustaceans.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, the Department of Marine Resources may issue special permits for the use of hydraulic and mechanical soft-shell clam dredges, following the procedure outlined in the Maine Revised Statutes, section 6074 of the department's laws. While it was contemplated that this authority be extended to commercial use of those devices, a strict interpretation of the reference to section 6074 may limit those uses to only experimental and research purposes. The purpose of this bill is to clarify that, while the procedure of section 6074 is to be followed, the permitted use of the dredges may be for commercial harvesting purposes.
