Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §4803, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

 5. Alcohol Awareness Day. Alcohol Awareness Day, the first Monday in December, shall be observed by studying for at least 45 minutes, a constructive approach toward the use of alcohol and the problems and dangers of alcohol abuse upon the individual, the family and society. The commissioner shall prepare appropriate materials for this observance.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to designate the first full week in December of each year as Alcohol Awareness Week, and to establish and incorporate Alcohol Awareness Day as a special observance day in the public schools to be observed on the first Monday in December. The special event day known as "Temperance Day" and currently observed in the schools on March 1st has been changed to Alcohol Awareness Day to be observed on the first Monday of December during Alcohol Awareness Week.

Alcohol use and misuse pervade every aspect of Maine life and transcend the responsibilities of many state departments and service agencies. As many as 1,400 Maine children are born each year with defects due to the maternal consumption of alcohol during pregnancy. An estimated 13% of 13 to 15-year olds and 26% of 16 to 19-year olds in Maine abuse alcohol. There are an estimated 80,000 adult alcoholics in Maine, 40,000 of whom are women. The rate of alcoholism among Maine's 197,700 citizens over 60 years of age is estimated to between 10% and 20%.

The costs of the consequences of alcohol abuse in Maine are staggering -- in terms of dollars, emotional trauma and lost human resources. Costs associated with lost production, health care, motor vehicle accidents, crime, fire and social responses are estimated at \$577,000,000 in Maine. Alcohol is a significant factor in an estimated 50% of fatal accidents, 80% of fire deaths, 65% of drownings, 75% of falls,

80% of arrests, 60% of child abuse cases and 36% of pedestrian accidents. It is estimated that 10% of the work force abuses alcohol and wastes 25% of worker productivity.

The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee is comprised of the Commissioners of Corrections, Educational and Cultural Services, Human Services and Mental Health and Mental Retardation. This committee was created by the Legislature, Public Law 1983, chapter 464, to collectively address the complex problems associated with alcoholism and substance abuse prevention, education and treatment problems. The Alcohol Awareness Week is consistent with current and proposed prevention efforts of the committee and all appropriate departments.
