19 Victuallers, Innkeepers and
20 Tavernkeepers.

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
23 follows:

24 30 MRSA §2752, as amended by PL 1975, c. 531, §2,
25 is further amended by adding at the end the follow-
26 ing:

27 The provisions of this section relating to the
28 composition of the licensing board and license expi-
29 ration dates do not apply to any municipality which
30 has designated the municipal officers as the licens-
31 ing board for the issuance of innkeepers',
32 victuallers' and tavernkeepers' licenses by local or-
33 dinance or charter provisions adopted under chapter
34 201-A or the Constitution of Maine, Article VIII,
35 Part Second, Section 1. Licenses granted in accord-
36 ance with this alternate method shall expire one year

1 from the date of issuance.

2 STATEMENT OF FACT

3 The purpose of this new draft is to clarify that
4 municipalities have home rule authority to establish
5 the alternate licensing procedure set out in this new
6 draft. The new draft clarifies that a municipality
7 may establish its town or city council or board of
8 selectmen as the licensing authority. Licenses
9 granted under this alternate procedure will expire
10 one year from the date of issuance, not automatically
11 on the last day of May as is currently the law.
