16 17 18	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
19 20	AN ACT to Amend the Weir Licensing Law.
21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26 27	Whereas, the existing weir laws do not adequately provide for the protection of fishing rights and privileges nor do they clearly establish the responsibilities and duties of weir licensees; and
28 29 30	Whereas, the necessary changes will not be effective prior to the 1985 sardine season unless enacted under emergency provisions; and
31 32 33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

- vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
  therefore,
- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 4 follows:
- 5 Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1023, as amended by PL 1983, c. 6 731, §5, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

## §1023. Expiration of license

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9 The license for the building or extension of a 10 fish weir or trap issued under section 1022 or any right or privilege granted by the Legislature for the 11 12 building or extension of any such fish weir or trap shall terminate and become void unless the weir or trap is built within one year from the date of the 13 14 license or the granting of that right or privilege 15 and maintained and operated in good faith for the du-16 17 ration of the license.

The weir shall be considered to be maintained and operated in good faith if the following conditions are met:

- 21 1. Annual license fee; bond coverage. The li22 censee shall pay his annual license fee and submit
  23 proof of the required bond coverage extending at
  24 least one year beyond the current license year;
  - 2. Inspection and repair. The licensee shall inspect and repair all stakes and brush of the weir structure so as to maintain it in condition to receive netting when fishing conditions warrant; and
  - 3. Report. The licensee shall complete these actions by July 15th of each year and shall report that completion to the commissioner and to the municipality within 7 days of that date on forms provided by the commissioner.

The commissioner shall, by December 31st each year, report to the municipality the name of the licensed owner and location of each weir and whether the weir was maintained and operated in good faith in that year.

3 4	Weir fishing for alewives is exempt from the provisions of this chapter.
5 6 7	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
8	STATEMENT OF FACT
9 10 11 12	The primary purpose of this new draft is to ensure that sardine weirs are operated in good faith and that the licensing requirements reflect the practical aspects of sardine fishing.
13 14	Alewife weirs are specifically exempted from these provisions of the weir law.
15 16	The emergency provision allows this bill to take effect in time for the 1985 fishing season.
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
