Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications or range changes which have been approved by the Department of Personnel and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

Sec. 4. Encumbered balances at year end. At the end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances shall not be carried more than once.

8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16	Part C of the amendment provides the statutory language needed to implement the Local Road Assistance Program increase enacted in the Part I Highway Fund Budget. This language will allow the \$3.16 million increase already budgeted for the upcoming biennium to be proportionately distributed to all program categories. Without this language, municipalities which receive an allocation under the minimum provisions of the Local Road Assistance Program will not benefit from the increased allocation.
