Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission on Limited Benefit Health Insurance is established. The commission shall consist of 8 members as follows: Two members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 members of the House Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 4 members to be appointed by the Governor of which one member shall be a representative from the health insurance industry and one member shall be a representative from a state agency representing Maine's elderly. The commission shall elect one of its members to serve as chairman: and be it further

Duties of commission. Resolved: That the commission shall study the propriety, benefits, advertising and sales practices of limited benefit health insurance policies and Medicare and Medicaid supplemental health policies sold within the State; and be it further

Report. Resolved: That the commission shall report its findings, together with any implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature; and be it further

Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission shall receive no compensation but shall be reimbursed for all necessary expenses.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

2 Gaps in Medicare coverage and the complexities of 3 the Medicare Program have created confusion and often 4 abuse in the medical insurance marketplace, and the 5 victim is the elderly consumer. Frequently, they are 6 seriously misinformed regarding the type of coverage 7 they are buying. In addition to purchasing insurance 8 policies specifically designed supplement to 9 Medicare, they buy nursing home, cancer, home care, accident and intensive care hospital policies and 10 11 more; policies which they probably do not need will probably never use. The purpose of this resolve 12 13 is to address these problems by establishing a commission to study these issues and report to the Sec-14 ond Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. 15

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
