The state-owned dam on Dead River, located in the was constructed in 1932. Town of Leeds, purpose of the dam has been to protect Androscoggin Lake from being fouled by the sewage and paper industry contaminants in the Androscoggin River. Since its construction, the State has held the dam in continuous ownership. Since 1971, responsibility for maintenance and operations of the staterepair, owned dam on Dead River has been assigned to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, State Soil and Water Conservation Commission. 1984, the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources decided that responsibility for this dam should not lie within their agency. They actively sought another owner for the dam and, having failed to find one, the department introduced legislation to abandon the state-owned dam on Dead River. Ιt intent of this bill to transfer custody of the dam from the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to the Department of Environmental Protection and to provide funds for continued operation. 10-year average cost for maintenance of the dam The is approximately \$600 annually. In the past, the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission has contracted with the Androscoggin Lake Improvement Corporation to oversee and accomplish any needed maintenance.

The Department of Environmental Protection has rated the water quality of the Androscoggin Lake at 14 parts phosphorus per million, while the Androscoggin River tests at 90-100 parts phosphorus per million. Algae bloom occurs at approximately 20 parts per million.

Historically, pollution control and establishment of water quality standards for Maine rivers and lakes have been a state responsibility. The State has recognized its responsibility for the past 50 years to retain ownership of the state-owned dam on Dead River. Although no state agency wants the responsibility for this dam, the structure is unique in preventing the polluted waters of the Androscoggin River to enter a great pond. This dam must not be destroyed or abandoned until such time as the water quality of the Androscoggin River at least equals or exceeds that of Androscoggin Lake.
