Duties of commission. Resolved: That the commission shall conduct a study, including, but not limited to, the following:

- 25 1. The inclusion in state employee health insur-26 ance of coverage for surgical opinions and testing 27 prior to hospital admission;
 - Smoking policies in the workplace;
- 3. The use of seat belts in state-owned vehicles and privately-owned vehicles where the owner is reimbursed by the State for mileage;
- 32 4. Income protection programs; and
- 33 5. The feasibility of implementing wellness pro-34 grams dealing with, but not limited to, the follow-35 ing:
- 36 A. The hazards of smoking;
- 37 B. Drug and alcohol abuse;
