Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §3305, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1967, c. 533, §1, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:
The office may prepare and distribute printed and audio-visual materials on matters within its statuto-ry jurisdiction. The director shall fix the prices at which publications of the office shall be sold or delivered. The office shall decide which publications shall be included and shall retain, without charge,
