The reimbursement rates for audiology speech-language pathology services and speech and hearing centers have not been increased since 1976. During the past 9 years, the costs of personnel, materials and equipment, travel and overall operating costs have increased substantially anywhere from 60% to 110%. The Department of Human Services has failed to meet this increase in the cost of providing audiology and speech-language pathology services. quests for increases were made in the years 1982, 1984. The present rates do not meet the 1983 and cost of providing this necessary service to citizens of the State.

This bill will increase the fee schedule and provide for increased reimbursement for audiology and speech-language pathology services on cost-related basis.
