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STATEMENT OF FACT

11 The purpose of this bill is to appropriate addi-12 tional money for the support of public mass transpor-13 tation. Currently, this program is funded at 14 \$400,000, which has not increased in the 7 years 15 since Public Law 1979, c. 505, was enacted.

16 In 1982, the Legislature further amended Public 17 1979, c. 505, to increase the State's commitment Law to public transportation by passing "An Act Providing 18 19 Greater Flexibility on the Use of State Public Trans-20 portation Funds for Operating Assistance to Public Transportation Providers," Public Law 1981, chapter 21 559. Although this Act increased the amount of state 22 23 operating assistance to public transportation providers from 10% to 1/2 the operating deficit in-24 25 curred, there has not been any additional appropriation to fund this change. 26

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
