Fund established 12 There is established a Pine Tree Partnership Fund 13 which shall be used to provide funding for research grants to small businesses within the State seeking to develop or introduce advanced technology into the 14 15 16 marketplace. This fund shall be a nonlapsing fund. 17 §353. Board 18 1. Establishment; membership. There is established the Pine Tree Partnership Fund Board which 19 20 shall consist of 15 members as follows: The Director of the State Planning Office, or his designee; the 21 22 Commissioner of Business, Occupational and Profes-23 sional Regulation or his designee; the Director of Energy Resources or his designee; the Commissioner of 24 25 Environmental Protection or his designee; the Commis-26 sioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources or his designee; the chairman of the Maine Development 27 28 Foundation or his designee; 2 members of the Senate, 29 appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 5 members 30 31 appointed by the Governor, of which at least one mem-32 ber shall be a representative of small business and 33 34 at least one member shall be a representative of organized labor. The board shall annually elect a 35 36 chairman from among its members.
