STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The purpose of this bill is to clarify and 16 strengthen the remedies available to consumers bring-17 ing private actions under the unfair trade practices 18 laws. Section 1 adopts the same definition of equitable relief that is currently available to consumers 19 in small claims court in the Maine Revised Statutes, 20 Title 14, section 7481. Section 2 permits consumers to recover attorneys' fees if they establish an un-21 22 23 fair trade practice, even if the consumer receives relief under another statute or under common law the-24 25 ory.
