12 13 14	'Emergency clause. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
15 16 17	Whereas, there are immediate needs to address the safety and recreational conflict regarding the use of all-terrain vehicles; and
18 19 20	Whereas, all-terrain vehicle registration is for the 12-month period commencing on July 1st of each year; and
21 22 23 24	Whereas, because of the July 1st registration date and the length of time required for the proposed study, these immediate needs could not otherwise begin to be addressed until July 1987; and
25 26 27 28 29 30	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Study. ation shall serve as lead agency to implement and coordinate a study the purpose of which shall be to make recommendations for management of all-terrain vehicles. This study shall include the recreational needs of all-terrain vehicle use, conflicts with other recreational activities and with landowners, safety matters, noise, damage and trespass issues, special apprehension problems posed by the maneuverability of all-terrain vehicles and special problems caused by the fact that many drivers are mi-The latter problems include problems of prosecution, parental financial responsibility and attitudes by parents, the community and law enforcement and judicial authorities.

3	FISCAL NOTE
4 5 6 7	It is estimated that enactment of this bill will result in an increase in dedicated revenues of \$36,000, annually, due to the proposed \$2 increase in the all-terrain vehicles annual registration fee.'
8	STATEMENT OF FACT
9 10 11 12 13	The purpose of this amendment is to provide for safety education on the operation of all-terrain vehicles and for a study of the recreational and safety needs of all-terrain vehicles and the conflicts arising from their use.
14 15 16 17 18	The amendment accomplishes this purpose by amending the all-terrain vehicle regulation passed in 1983, rather than repealing that law and adding all-terrain vehicle regulation to the snowmobile law which the original draft did.
19 20 21	The registration fee is increased from $\$5$ to $\$7$ in the amendment. The original draft increased the fee to $\$11.25$.
22 23 24 25	This cost of this study is \$20,000. A major portion of that is for compensation of a project leader who must be added to the bureau for the life of the project.
