- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §4641-A, as amended by PL 1983, 4 c. 859, Pt. M, §§9 and 13, is further amended to read:

§4641-A. Rate of tax

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- There is imposed upon each the grantor and the grantee a tax upon the privilege of transferring and receiving title to real property at the rate of \$1.10 for each \$500 or fractional part thereof, of consideration therefor. The granter shall be liable for payment of the tax.
- Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §4641-B, as amended by PL 1983, 14 c. 859, Pt. M, §10, is further amended by adding at 15 the end a new paragraph to read:
- 16 The State Tax Assessor shall pay over all receipts to the Treasurer of State daily. One half of 17 18 the net revenue received by the State Tax Assessor in accordance with this section shall be paid to the Maine State Housing Authority which shall deposit the 19 20 21 funds in the Housing Opportunities for Maine Fund created by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sec-22 23 tion 4733. The remaining half shall be credited 24 the General Fund.
 - Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, Section 1, of this Act shall take effect on June 1, 1985, and Section 2 of this Act shall take effect with regard to payments of tax assessed on transfers occurring on or after June 1, 1985.
