20 21 22	Further amend the bill in that part designated "§1368-C" by striking out all of subsections 2 and 3 and inserting in their place the following:
23 24 25 26	'2. Exceptions. The requirements of subsection 1 do not apply to a rear seat passenger when all other seating positions equipped with seat belts are occupied.'
27 28 29 30 31	Further amend the bill in that part designated "§1368-C.", in subsection 5, in the 2nd line (page 2, line 22 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "December 1, 1985" and inserting in its place the following: 'July 1, 1986'
32 33 34	Further amend the bill in that part designated "§1368-C." by renumbering the subsections to read consecutively.

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 383, L.D. 1050

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5 6	The purpose of this amendment is to require that the driver of a motor vehicle be personally responsible that all passengers younger than the age of 10 years are properly secured by a seat belt or a child restraint seat effective July 1, 1986.
7 8	A grace period will be in effect until July 1, 1986.
9 10 11 12 13 14 15	Seat belts reduce by 1/2 the chances of serious injury in an accident. Motor vehicle crashes account for over 200 deaths per year in Maine. Nationally, motor vehicle crashes result in more cases of paraplegia and quadraplegia than all other causes combined and are major causes of epilepsy and brain damage.
