27 28	Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and		
29 30 31 32	Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the State Lottery Commission will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985; and		
33 34 35	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following		

- legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,

- 4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- Sec. 1. Allocation of State Lottery Fund. In order to provide the necessary expenses for operation
 and administration of the State Lottery Commission,
 the following amounts, or as much as may be necessary, are allocated from the revenues derived from
 operations of the State Lottery Fund.

- Sec. 2. Allotments required. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures from these allocations on the basis of these allotments and not otherwise.
- Sec. 3. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that the allocation of funds by the Legislature, as provided by this Act, shall apply to the operating expenses only and that these allocations shall be allotted and approved under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5.
- Sec. 4. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature, and those reclassifications and range changes which have been approved by the Department of Person-

3 4 5 6	Sec. 5. Exclusion. Exclusive of sections 1 to 4, up to \$70,000 for fiscal year 1986 and \$50,000 for fiscal year 1987 may be expended for Capital Expenditures.
7 8 9	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1985.
