## 9 STATEMENT OF FACT

The 9 Older American Programs in Maine are: Six Retired Senior Volunteer Programs, 2 Foster Grandparent Programs and one Senior Companion Program. In addition to providing volunteer services to over 400 different agencies throughout the State, including all counties, these programs give elders an opportunity to be an active part of their communities. The purpose of this bill is to expand the number of volunteer hours provided by 9 Older American Programs from the current level of 600,000 hours to a new level of 660,000 hours per year.

The Retired Senior Volunteer Programs are for persons over 60 years of age. They have an opportunity to volunteer with different age groups at a wide variety of nonprofit organizations and agencies. In some instances, they are reimbursed for travel and meals.

The Foster Grandparent Programs are for low-income elders who wish to volunteer with children with special needs. They each receive a stipend of \$2,000 per year in addition to meal and travel reimbursements.

The Senior Companion Program is for low-income elders who wish to volunteer to assist home-bound elders. They receive a stipend of \$2,000 per year in addition to meal and travel reimbursements.

All 3 volunteer programs provide placement, training, insurance and special volunteer recognition events.

Since the principle source of funds is the Federal Agency, ACTION, the fiscal management procedures for receipt and expenditure of funds are established in accordance with federal regulations. The project grantees or sponsors, funded by ACTION, are required to demonstrate their capability to safeguard public expenditures.
