	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7076, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1983, c. 797, §3, is further amended to read:
	1. Residents over 65 years of age. A complimentary license to hunt, trap or fish shall be issued to any resident of Maine who is 70 65 years of age or older and applies for it to the commissioner. The application shall be accompanied by a birth certificate or other certified evidence of the applicant's date of birth and residency. Each license issued under this subsection shall remain valid through December 31st of the 2nd complete calendar year following the year of issuance.
