Any population remainder within the municipality shall be included in a district drawn to cross the municipal boundary, provided that such population remainder of the municipality must be contiguous to another municipality or municipalities included in the district.'

Further amend the resolution in the 3rd paragraph before the statement of fact in the 3rd line (page 2, line 17 in L.D.) by inserting after the word "Senators" the words 'and Representatives' and in the 5th line (page 2, line 19 in L.D.) by inserting after the word "Senators" the words 'and Representatives'

Further amend the resolution in the 2nd paragraph before the statement of fact, in the 4th line from the end (page 2, line 31 in L.D.) by striking out the word "amendment" and inserting in its place the word 'amendments' and in the 2nd and 3rd lines from the end (page 2, lines 32 and 33 in L.D.) by striking out the word "amendment" and inserting in its place the word 'amendments'
