## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 112TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 395, L.D.
1105, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the Laws Requiring
Certification of Seed Potatoes."

10 Amend the bill by inserting after the title and 11 before the enacting clause the following:

12 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-13 lature do not become effective until 90 days after 14 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the quality of the Maine potato sold in the market place is essential to maintain the economic viability of the potato industry in Maine; and

18 Whereas, the quality of the Maine potato sold is 19 determined in large part by the quality of the seed; 20 and

21 Whereas, certified seed potatoes must meet mini-22 mum standards for planting to insure quality and to 23 promote the reduction of disease, thereby protecting 24 farmers from the spread of potato diseases from field 25 to field; and

26 Whereas, available evidence supports the conten-27 tion that requiring the planting of certified seed 28 has, in fact, contributed to the decrease in the ap-29 pearance of bacterial ring rot; and

30 Whereas, the Department of Agriculture, Food and 31 Rural Resources is responsible for enforcement of the 32 certification program and requests these changes in 33 law to strengthen their enforcement capability; and

34 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 35 these fact create an emergency within the meaning of

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1 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 2 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-3 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 4 therefore,'

5 Further amend the bill by striking out everything 6 after the amending clause and before the statement of 7 fact and inserting in its place the following:

8 'No seed potato seed, the product of which is in-9 tended for sale, shall may be planted in the State in 10 lots of one or more acres unless that seed meets the 11 minimum disease standards of Maine certified seed potatees as defined is certified in accordance with 12 rules adopted by the commissioner. These rules may include without limitation requirements for filing 13 14 15 reports with the commissioner and requirements for filing records to the commissioner or his designee, 16 17 upon request, which demonstrate that the potatoes so planted have been properly certified. A person, firm 18 19 or corporation that plants potatoes in violation of this section shall be subject to a fine of \$20 civil 20 21 penalty of not less than \$20 and not more than \$10022 per acre for each acre or part of an acre planted in 23 violation of this section; provided that failure to file complete and accurate reports or failure to pro-24 25 vide complete and accurate records in accordance with the rules adopted by the commissioner shall be an ad-26 27 ditional violation resulting in a separate civil pen-28 alty of not less than \$200 nor more than \$1,000 for each such failure. 29 The fine Any civil penalty collected under this section shall be payable 30 the to 31 of State and credited without lapsing to Treasurer 32 the commissioner for the enforcement of this section. 33 The commissioner shall adopt and may amend rules con-34 sistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, 35 Title 5, chapter 375, to implement this section. Pri-36 or to their adoption, these rules shall be reported 37 to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture by 38 January 15, 1980 for its review. In addition to the 39 enforcement powers and penalties established in this 40 section, the commissioner may issue subpoenas to any

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individual in order to compel delivery of any reports 1 or records which are required under this section. 2 These subpoenas shall be enforceable by any court of 3 4 competent jurisdiction. 5 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-6 7 proved. 8 STATEMENT OF FACT 9 This amendment gives the Commissioner of Agricul-10 ture, Food and Rural Resources the power to issue subpoenas to potato growers to compel them to deliver 11 12 reports and records to confirm the kind of seed 13 planted and it authorizes the department to formulate 14 rules designed to increase enforcement capability. 15 3292042385
