IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE	
AN ACT Relating to Loitering on Public Sidewalks.	
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:	
17-A MRSA §517 is enacted to read:	
§517. Loitering	
1. A person is guilty of loitering if he uses a public sidewalk other than as a pedestrian and re- fuses to remove himself from the public sidewalk af- ter being ordered to do so by a law enforcement offi- cer.	
2. Loitering is a Class E Crime.
