17 AN ACT to Promote Aviation and Aerospace  
18 Technology in Maine Schools.  
19

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
21 follows:

22 20-A MRSA §13004-A is enacted to read:

23 §13004-A. Aerospace technology or aerospace applied  
24 sciences

25 1. Certification. The state board shall, by  
26 rule, establish requirements and procedures for cer-  
27 tification of teachers in the subject areas of aero-  
28 space technology theory and aerospace applied sci-  
29 ences.

30 2. Requirements. Any applicant for certifica-  
31 tion under this section shall, in addition to meeting  
32 the requirements for certification otherwise set out  
33 in this chapter, meet the following requirements.

1 A. The applicant must hold and maintain current  
2 licenses and permits required by federal or state  
3 law which would be necessary for employment in  
4 the specific field of study for which certifica-  
5 tion is sought.

6 B. Any requirements concerning work experience  
7 or training necessary for renewal of any license  
8 for employment in a specific field shall be eval-  
9 uated as part of the in-service training required  
10 for the renewal of the applicant's teaching cer-  
11 tificate in that subject area.

12 C. For certificates issued in the area of  
13 airframe or power plant technician, the applicant  
14 must, in addition to meeting any requirements re-  
15 lating to in-service training, meet the require-  
16 ments set out in the relevant portions of the  
17 Federal Air Regulations and must possess a valid  
18 and current inspection authorization rating.

19 STATEMENT OF FACT

20 The purpose of this bill is to provide for teach-  
21 er certification in the areas of aerospace technology  
22 theory and aerospace applied sciences.
