COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 841, L.D. 1191, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Retirement Compensation for Judges Who Ceased to Serve Prior to December 1, 1984."

Amend the bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following:

'AN ACT to Provide Pension Rights to Morris G. Pilot.'

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. Pension rights for Morris G. Pilot. Morris G. Pilot shall have the pension rights granted in this Act.

Sec. 2. Retirement pension. Morris G. Pilot, on reaching the age of 65, shall have the right to a pension equal to 3/4 of his average final compensation as a District Court Judge. "Average final compensation" is defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1201, subsection 3. The pension shall be adjusted annually by a cost-of-living factor, as determined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1358.

Sec. 3. Survivors benefits. On the death of Morris G. Pilot, his spouse Ann S. Pilot, if living, shall receive a pension equal to 3/8 of his average final compensation or 1/2 of his retirement allowance at the time of his death, whichever is greater. If his spouse predeceases him, his child, Samantha M. Pilot, if under 18 years of age at the time of his death, shall receive this benefit until the attain-
