## STATEMENT OF FACT

6 This bill would help to ease the financial burden of obtaining a post-secondary education by exempting from the sales tax those books purchased for use as 7 8 9 required texts in any course of study at any post-secondary educational institution operating in 10 The bill also provides compensation for loss 11 Maine. of revenue because of this exemption by taxing publi-12 cations which are of an obscene nature. 13

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
