IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
AN ACT to Reduce the Costs of Workers' Compensation.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
39 MRSA §110-A is enacted to read:
<u>§110-A. Assessment of attorney's fees against em-</u> ployers
In any proceeding under this chapter when an em- ployee prevails, the commissioner shall assess against the employer an amount equal to the employer costs of witness fees and attorney's fees and costs. This amount shall be deposited in an account dedi- cated to defraying the costs of administration under this chapter.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

A large number of workers' compensation proceedings are delayed by employers who insist on litigating just claims in the apparent hope of inducing partial settlements. Statistics show that employees prevail in most proceedings. This bill provides a disincentive for delaying resolution of claims.

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
