2. Membership; appointment. The committee shall 5 6 consist of 5 members to be appointed by the Governor, 7 subject to review by the joint standing committee of 8 the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and to confirmation by the Legislature. The members 9 shall be appointed as follows: Two members represent-10 11 ing the fields of business and industry in the State; 12 one member representing labor interests in the State; 13 one member representing the field of health services in the State; and one member representing the field 14 of education in the State. The committee shall annu-15 16 ally elect one of its members to serve as chairman.

17 <u>3. Terms. The term of office of each member</u> 18 shall be 3 years; except that of those first ap-19 pointed, 2 shall be appointed for a term of 3 years; 20 2 shall be appointed for a term of 2 years; and one 21 shall be appointed for a term of one year. Any va-22 cancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unex-23 pired term.

- 24 <u>4. Compensation. Members of the committee shall</u>
   25 <u>be compensated according to Title 5, chapter 379.</u>
- 26 5. Duties. The committee shall:
- 27 A. Carry out the duties assigned to it under 28 chapter 403;

29B. Advise the State Board of Education, the com-30missioner and the Legislature concerning matters31relating to post-secondary vocational-technical32education; and

C. Adopt rules, subject to the provisions of Ti tle 5, chapter 375, to carry out its responsibil ities.

2. Committee. "Committee" means the 1 State 2 Post-secondary Vocational-technical Education Commit-3 tee. Sec. 4. 20-A MRSA §10104, as amended by PL 1983, 4 5 c. 422, §19, is further amended to read: 6 §10104. Committee's general duties and authority; 7 establishment of additional institutes 8 1. General duties. The state beard committee shall maintain and operate the institutes established 9 10 in section 10103 and have policy-making and planning 11 authority for them. Authority. The state beard committee may, in 12 2. 13 operating these institutes: 14 Offer courses of study; Α. B. Grant diplomas and certificates on completion 15 of a course of study; 16 17 C. Confer associate degrees based upon 2 years 18 of instruction with equipment and facilities 19 which will safeguard the integrity of the degrees conferred: 20 21 Charge tuition and other reasonable fees; D. 22 Ε. Establish gualifications for admission; and 23 F. Accept and expend all funds for 24 post-secondary vocational education received by the department from: 25 26 (1)The General Fund; 27 (2) Gifts and donations either from public 28 or private sources which are offered unconditionally or under conditions approved by 29 30 the state beard committee; or 31 (3) Fees. 32 Establishment of additional vocational- tech-3. nical institutes. 1 tablish, maintain and operate vocational-technical institutes to promote specialized training for persons who give evidence of special aptitude or need and who desire specialized training designed specifically to train for service in trade, industry or commerce.

## 9 §10105. Directors of institutes

Appointment of directors. The commissioner,
 with the approval of the state beard committee, shall
 appoint the directors of the institutes.

2. <u>Salary range</u>. The commissioner, with the approval of the state beard committee, shall establish
 the salary range for directors and assistant directors.

17 3. Job title and salary range for new positions. 18 The state beard committee, consistent with Title 26, 19 chapter 12, shall make recommendations to the Depart-20 ment of Personnel and the Bureau of the Budget concerning the appropriate job title and salary range 21 for each newly-created position in the unclassified 22 service at an institute. The recommendations shall be based on the level of job responsibilities of the 23 24 25 position created.

26 Change of job title and salary range. The 4. 27 state beard committee, consistent with Title 26, 28 chapter 12, shall make recommendations to the Depart-29 ment of Personnel and the Bureau of the Budget to 30 change the job title or salary range of any existing 31 position in the unclassified service at an institute 32 if an identifiable change in job responsibilities oc-33 curs.

36 §10106. Funding levels; capital construction plan; 37 budget

Prior to September 1 Funding levels. lst of 1. even-numbered years, the state beard committee shall 2 certify and present to the Governor the funding 3 lev-4 els which it recommends for the operation of the in-5 stitutes. It shall report those recommendations to 6 Legislature prior to November 15th of eventhe 7 numbered years.

8 2. Long-range capital construction plan. With 9 the requested funding levels, the state beard 10 committee shall submit a long-range capital construc-11 tion plan in priority order. This plan shall be sub-12 mitted to the Legislature with the required report.

13 3. Costs of maintenance, repairs and capital construction. Notwithstanding any other provision of 14 law, the directors shall include the costs of mainte-15 16 nance, repairs and capital construction at the institutes in the funding level requests presented to the 17 18 state board committee. In the preparation, development and submission of funding requests for mainte-19 20 nance, repairs and capital construction, the state 21 beard committee shall consult with the Bureau of Pub-22 lic Improvements. Funds appropriated for maintenance, repairs and capital construction at the insti-23 24 tutes shall be allocated and expended only for autho-25 rized purposes.

26 Sec. 7. 20-A MRSA §10109, as amended by PL 1983, 27 c. 422, §20, is further amended to read:

28 §10109. State scholarships at the vocational- tech-29 nical institutes

Scholarships. The state beard committee
 shall develop and administer a program of scholar ships for students enrolled at an institute. A stu dent selected to receive a scholarship shall fulfill
 the following qualifications:

A. Show evidence of the qualifications necessary
to successfully complete the course of study and
to become a competent craftsman in a trade or industrial pursuit;

B. Show demonstrated ability and willingness to
 support the expenses of training; and

- 1 C. Show demonstrated need of partial financial 2 assistance to pay the cost of attendance at the 3 institute.
- 4 2. <u>Limitation</u>. A scholarship may not exceed one 5 semester of tuition in one year.

6 3. <u>Allocation of scholarships</u>. Amounts availa-7 ble for these scholarships shall be distributed annu-8 ally by the state beard committee to the institutes 9 as follows:

- 10 A. \$1,500 or the equivalent of 6 full scholar-11 ships to each institute; and
- B. Allocation of the balance of the scholarship
  fund to each institute in the same proportion as
  the institute's enrollment is of all of the institutes for the fall semester of the prior year.
- 16 4. <u>Awards</u>. Awards shall be based on evidence of 17 individual need and worth.
- 18 5. National Guard Scholarship Program. Members 19 of the Maine National Guard with over 10 years' continuous service may be awarded scholarships 20 at vocational-technical institutes not to exceed 3 cred-21 22 it hours or the equivalent each semester. The guard shall select those who will receive scholarships from 23 24 among those members eligible for admission to a 25 vocational-technical institute. The program shall be 26 administered by the state beard committee.

- 30 2. <u>Guidelines</u>. The state beard committee may 31 establish guidelines by which each director may make 32 rules for the control, movement and parking of vehi-33 cles within the limits of the property owned by or 34 under the control of the institute.
- 35 4. <u>Evidence</u> and <u>waiver</u>. The state beard 36 <u>committee</u> may adopt the provisions of Title 30, sec-37 tion 2151, subsection 3, paragraph A, relating to 38 prima facie evidence and the establishment of a waiv-
