COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 852, L.D. 1208, Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Liquor Laws."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 28 MRSA §701, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

8. Fees for auxiliary licenses. Fees for auxiliary licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the premises shall be \$100.

Sec. 2. 28 MRSA §701-A, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

8. Auxiliary license. The following premises shall be eligible for an auxiliary license -- spirituous, vinous and malt beverages:

A. Premises located at a ski area which are owned and operated by a Class A restaurant licensee located at that ski area; and

B. Premises located at a ski area which are owned and operated by a hotel licensee located at that ski area.

Sec. 3. 28 MRSA §810 is enacted to read:

§810. Auxiliary licenses at ski areas

The commission may issue one auxiliary license for additional premises to any Class A restaurant licensee located at a ski area or any hotel licensee located at a ski area if the following requirements

1 are met.

2 1. Location. The additional premises are located
3 at the same ski area where the Class A restaurant or
4 hotel is licensed.

5 2. Food. Food is for sale at the additional
6 premises, although not necessarily prepared there.

7 3. Properly equipped. The additional premises
8 are properly equipped, including tables and chairs.

9 4. Licensed by Department of Human Services. The
10 additional premises are licensed by the Department of
11 Human Services.'

12 STATEMENT OF FACT

13 Some licensees carry on the activities in more
14 than one location under the direction and management
15 of a single person. At the present time, each sepa-
16 rate location must maintain a separate liquor license
17 which sometimes imposes a significant financial and
18 administrative burden on both the licensee and the
19 commission. The purpose of this amendment is to pro-
20 vide an auxiliary license available to Class A res-
21 taurants and hotels located at ski areas which will
22 enable them to operate an additional licensed loca-
23 tion at the ski area for a substantially reduced fee.
