COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " to H.P. 854, L.D.
1210, Bill, "AN ACT Concerning Reports to the Federal
Government Relating to Missing Children."

10 Amend the Bill by striking out all of the 3rd, 11 4th and 5th lines after the amending clause (page 1, 12 lines 26 to 28 in L.D.) and inserting in their place 13 the following:

14 '§2151. Missing children; information sent to Na-15 tional Crime Information Center'

16 Further amend the Bill in that part designated 17 "§2151." by striking out all of subsection 2 (page 2, 18 lines 9 to 16 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the 19 following:

'2. Report. Upon receiving a report of a missing child, a law enforcement agency shall conduct a preliminary investigation to determine whether the child is missing. Within 48 hours of receiving the 20 21 22 23 report, if the preliminary investigation reveals that 24 25 there is probable cause to believe the child is 26 missing, the agency shall immediately enter identify-27 ing and descriptive information about the missing 28 child into the National Crime Information Center com-29 puter and into any state computer which the Commis-30 sioner of Public Safety may designate to receive that 31 information. Law enforcement agencies having direct 32 access to the National Crime Information Center computer shall enter and retrieve the data directly and 33 shall cooperate in the entry and retrieval of data on 34 behalf of law enforcement agencies which do not have 35 36 direct access to the systems.

37 Immediately after a missing child is located, the law

enforcement agency which located or returned the missing child shall notify the law enforcement agency 1 2 3 having jurisdiction over the investigation, and that 4 agency shall cancel the entry from the National Crime Information Center computer. 5 6 STATEMENT OF FACT 7 The purpose of this amendment is to refer to the proper federal agency for receiving missing children 8 9 information. 10 The amendment also more clearly spells out when 11 and how a law enforcement agency is to make a missing child report. 12 3761052085 13
