- 1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 2 3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-4 5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 6 therefore,
- 7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine 8 follows:
- 9 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §953 is enacted to read:
- 10 §953. Workers' Compensation Commission
- 11 Major policy-influencing positions. The fol-12 lowing positions are major policy-influencing positions within the Workers' Compensation Commission. 13 14 Notwithstanding any other law, these positions 15 their successor positions shall be subject to this 16 chapter:
- 17 A. Assistant to the chairman.
- 18 Sec. 2. 39 MRSA §92, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 19 1983, c. 479, §16, is repealed and the following enacted in its place. 20
- 21 2. Employees. The chairman shall appoint an assistant to the chairman, who shall serve at his plea-sure. ## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that positions in the Workers'
Compensation Commission will be established, evalu-
ated and assigned a pay range in a manner consistent
with the management of other similar positions in
State Government. The bill provides for a prompt
evaluation of key positions in the Workers' Compensa-
tion Commission to assure that the positions are
properly assessed in regard to workers' compensation
system changes in the past 2 years.

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
