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the Treasurer of State, to be credited to the General Fund of the State, a sum equal to .50% of the total contributions of regular wagers and 2.27% of the total contributions of exotic wagers to all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made during the months of April through October, but only a sum equal to .50% of total contributions of regular wagers and .50% of the contributions of exotic wagers to pari-mutuel pools during the months of November through March of any year, at any race or race meet licensed under this chapter. Each licensee shall calculate on an annual basis the difference between the sum paid by him pursuant to this paragraph, as it then existed, for calendar year 1981 and the sum paid by him pursuant to this paragraph for each succeeding calendar year. One-half of this difference shall be used for the purpose of supplementing purse money-

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equal to 1% of the total contributions on sum regular wagers and a sum equal to 1% of the contributions on exotic wagers on all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any race or race meet censed under this chapter shall be paid and returned to the licensees for the purpose of supplementing purse money. A sum equal to 1 1/2% of the total contributions on exotic wagers on all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any race or race meet licensed under this chapter shall be retained by the licensee and shall be added to purse money. This sum shall be divided equally among the licensees in the proportion that the number of racing days of a licensee granted by the commission bears to the total number of racing days granted in any one year by the commission. ments shall be made to said licensees by the end of the calendar year.

A sum equal to 1 1/2% of the tax on exotic wagers on all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any race or race meet licensed under this chapter shall be retained by the licensees.

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The holding of harness racing meets throughout the year is essential to the racing industry. Year-round racing will generate additional income for participants, including drivers, officials and the many other persons performing services in connection with the harness racing industry and foster increased employment of persons working in or otherwise affiliated with the racing industry. In many cases, such income is necessary to enable the persons to support their families. Racing the entire year will also help provide for the large expenses for care and maintenance of race horses.

Snowplowing and heating expenses during deep winter discourages capital improvements and deters the tracks from holding race meets during the winter sea-This bill will permit racing associations to retain the additional amounts necessary to cover the substantial expenses such associations would incur by racing during these months. Although the General Fund will be reduced somewhat, the Sire Stakes Fund, provided for in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 8, section 281, relating to the promotion and encouragement of a strain of Maine standardbred horses, amount credited to the Stipend Fund, provided by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, section 62, relating to agricultural societies, and purse supplements, relating to amounts accruing to the drivers, will be substantially increased, in amounts far greater than this reduction to the General Fund, by reason of increased racing dates that will be made possible by In sum, this bill will enable racing asthis bill. sociations to operate profitably and supply a means of livelihood to persons employed in the pari-mutuel industry.

The General Fund will be reduced by approximately \$45,000 annually.

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
