AN ACT to Create Inactive Professional Licenses for Members of the Armed Forces.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
32 MRSA c. 105 is enacted to read:
CHAPTER 105
INACTIVE PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES
§9901. Licensees entering Armed Forces; inactive licenses
Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any person holding a valid professional or occupational license or certificate issued pursuant to this Title or issued by any bureau, board or commission within the Department of Business, Occupational and Professional Regulation who enters the United States Armed

1	Forces shall, upon request, for the duration of that
2	person's service in the Armed Forces, be issued an
3	inactive license or certificate. A person may be is-
4	sued only one inactive license or certificate pursu-
5	ant to this section. The fee for the issuance of an
6	inactive license or certificate, issued pursuant to
7	this section, shall be 10% of the fee for an active
8	license or certificate for the same type of profes-
9	sional or occupational license.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that persons who hold professional or occupational licenses and who enter the Armed Forces shall be eligible for inactive licenses for the duration of their service in the military. The fee for the inactive licenses would be 10% of the fee for an active license.
