18 Licenses for Members of the Armed

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 32 MRSA c. 105 is enacted to read:

24 CHAPTER 105

25 INACTIVE PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES

26 §9901. Licensees entering Armed Forces; inactive li-
27 ceses

28 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any
29 person holding a valid professional or occupational
30 license or certificate issued pursuant to this Title
31 or issued by any bureau, board or commission within
32 the Department of Business, Occupational and Profes-
33 sional Regulation who enters the United States Armed

1 Forces shall, upon request, for the duration of that
2 person's service in the Armed Forces, be issued an
3 inactive license or certificate. A person may be is-
4 sued only one inactive license or certificate pursu-
5 ant to this section. The fee for the issuance of an
6 inactive license or certificate, issued pursuant to
7 this section, shall be 10% of the fee for an active
8 license or certificate for the same type of profes-
9 sional or occupational license.

10 STATEMENT OF FACT

11 The purpose of this bill is to provide that per-
12 sons who hold professional or occupational licenses
13 and who enter the Armed Forces shall be eligible for
14 inactive licenses for the duration of their service
15 in the military. The fee for the inactive licenses
16 would be 10% of the fee for an active license.

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
