1 §13029. Support system

- 1. Employment. No public school or private school approved for tuition purposes under section 2901, subsection 2, paragraph B, may employ an administrator unless it has an approved, locally designed, support system or has received specific authorization from the commissioner in accordance with state board rules.
- 9 <u>2. Purpose. The purpose of an approved support</u> 10 system is to:
- 11 A. Provide strong support services for develop-12 ing good administrative and school leadership 13 skills to administrators;
- B. Provide assistance, review and evaluation of progress of the administrator action plan to all administrators who are candidates for a higher level of certification or wish to renew a senior level certificate; and
- 19 <u>C. Provide an annual evaluation of progress of the administrator action plan.</u>
- 3. Membership. The school board of the school administrative unit shall select the support team in accordance with state board rules.
- 4. Administrator action plan. An administrator action plan is developed by the support system in consultation with the administrator. The action plan shall be considered an employee record and shall be kept confidential in accordance with sections 6101 and 6102.
- 30 <u>5. Approval. Each administrative unit's support</u> 31 system is subject to approval by the commissioner.
- 32 6. School administrative unit evaluation. The 33 support system is separate from local practices and 34 procedures regarding the supervision and evaluation 35 of an administrator for retention by an administra-36 tive unit.

7. State board rules. The state board shall develop rules governing this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

As part of the educational reforms of 1984, the 111th Legislature upgraded the certification standards for teachers. A central part of the certification process was the establishment of locally based support systems. If the school administration is to play the role designed for them in the support team process and in the evaluation of teachers for promotion and retention, well qualified administrators are crucial.

Increasing the standards of administrator certification is a necessary outgrowth of increasing the certification standards of teachers. Improvement in the certification standards of one is dependent on improvement in standards of the other. Improvement in the quality of education for students is dependent on both the quality of teachers and the quality of educational leadership in the schools.

This bill establishes a 2-level certification of principals and superintendents. It sets basic standards for each level and a support team to assess the strengths and weaknesses of a candidate applying for a renewal of a certificate or a higher level certificate. It also provides for an action plan to specify the criteria the principal or superintendent must meet for certification. These certification procedures will be part of the new certification statutes passed in the 111th Legislature which will become effective on July 1, 1988. The State Board of Education already must make rules for the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, chapter 502 by April 1, 1988.
