AN ACT to Increase the Allocation for
Personal Services Expenditures under
the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for Fiscal Year 1985.
Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
lature do not become effective until 90 days after
adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate un-
til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and
Whereas, costs incurred for Personal Services of
Response Personnel, under the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund, must be made in accordance with an allocation
approved by the Legislature; and
Whereas, an unexpected increase in the number of
hazardous waste incident reponses has occurred during
fiscal year 1985, to date; and

1 2 3 4 5 6	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
7 8	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

The increase in hazardous waste incidents during the first quarter of fiscal year 1985 necessitated the utilization of additional personnel over and above the 5 1/2 originally allocated during the First Regular Session of the 111th Legislature. Steps have been taken to request an increase of 2 Oil and Hazardous Material Specialists effective July 1, 1985, as part of the Part I budget request for fiscal year 1986-87. The increase in allocation requested in this bill is to help meet current fiscal year obligations due to the loan of personnel from other Bureau of Oil and Hazardous Materials Control programs to support hazardous waste incident field responses.

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
