IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
AN ACT to Establish a Funding Mechanism to Make the Joint Environmental Training Program Self-supporting.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
32 MRSA §4173-A, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 832, §1, is amended to read:
3. <u>Self-supporting</u> . Aside from the start-up cost provided in the bill, this This program shall be self-supporting from fees. The Commissioner of Envi- ronmental Protection shall report to the Firs't Regu- lar Session of the 112th Legislature no later than February 1, 1985, on the necessary fee schedule.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

2 With the establishment of a continuing educational program, the Legislature has required the program 3 to be self-supporting. The proposed amendment broad-ens the fund sources allowed as a base of support, 4 5 6 including voluntary contributions, donations and grants. This change is consistent with the provision 7 in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 8 4173-A, subsection 2 which allows both public and 9 private funds to be used for the purposes of the pro-10 gram. 11

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
