Volunteers, nonprofit and government organizations serving the deaf, hearing impaired and speech impaired persons shall be eligible for a 70% rate reduction on intrastate toll rates. To qualify for the reduction, the organization must file an affidavit with the telephone company on a form approved by the Public Utilities Commission, stating that a majority of the telephone calls made from the telephone or telephones for which the reduction is requested are to or on behalf of deaf, hearing impaired and speech impaired persons who must rely on a teletypewriter for telephone communications. The Department of Human Services shall reimburse the telephone companies for any revenues which would be lost as a result of these rate reductions.
