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Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to provide that Judges relieved of their duties pending investigation of possible misconduct not be paid during that period of time?"

The legal voters of each town and city, plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary State in the same manner as votes for members of of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the turns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal voters are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

The purpose of this constitutional resolution is to require that, if a Judge is relieved of his duties pending an investigation of possible misconduct, he shall not be paid during that time. If it is determined that no misconduct occurred, he may be repaid for the compensation lost.

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
