19 **Authorizing Expenditures of Aroostook**

22 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves
23 of the Legislature do not become effective until 90
24 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies;
25 and

26 Whereas, Aroostook County has certain expenses
27 and liabilities which must be met as they become due;
28 and

29 Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the
30 year 1985 hereinafter mentioned be immediately as-
31 sessed in order to provide the required revenue for
32 the county; and

33 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
34 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
35 the Constitution of Maine and require the following

1 legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
2 therefore, be it

4 **Sec. 1. Aroostook County; taxes apportioned.**
5 **Resolved:** That the following sum is granted as a tax
6 on Aroostook County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts
7 and necessary expenses of the county as authorized
8 herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1985:

14 **Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized.** **Resolved:** That the following sums, based on
