Commission established. There is es-14 tablished a Special Select Commission on the Adminis-15 tration and Financing of General Assistance, which 16 shall investigate present and alternative methods. of 17 administering and financing the general assistance

program within the State.

19 Membership. The commission shall consist of 1. 20 13 members as follows: Three representatives from 21 the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources, ap-22 pointed by the Speaker of House; one Senator from the 23 Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources, ap-24 pointed by the President of the Senate; one represen-25 tative of the Department of Human Services, appointed 26 by the Commissioner of Human Services; and 2 repre-27 sentatives of municipalities, not from the same municipality, one appointed by the Speaker of the House 28 29 and one appointed by the President of the Senate, in 30 consultation with the Maine Municipal Association; 2 31 municipal welfare directors or assessors, one ap-32 pointed by the Speaker of the House, one appointed by 33 the President of the Senate, in consultation with the 34 Welfare Director Association; 2 representatives of 35 private nonprofit charitable organizations with 36 knowledge and experience in general assistance, one 37 appointed by the Speaker of the House and one by the 38 President of the Senate; and 2 representatives of 39 low-income recipients of general assistance; one appointed by the Speaker of the House and one by the 40

1 President of the Senate.

2 Duties. The commission shall inquire into 2. 3 the experience and adequacy of the present methods of administration and financing of the general assist-4 5 ance program and the extent to which low-income citi-6 zens currently receive the benefits provided by law 7 and required to provide the basic necessities essen-8 tial to maintain themselves and their families. The commission shall investigate alternative methods of 9 10 administration of the financing of the general as-11 sistance program to more completely, efficiently or 12 more equitably meet the program's objectives. The 13 commission's inquiry shall include, but not be lim-14 ited to, whether the State should assume more com-15 plete responsibility for financing and administering The commission shall make recom-16 general assistance. 17 mendations to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature, including recommended changes in the 18 19 laws, administration and appropriations.

20 З. Staff assistance. The Department of Human 21 Services and the Division of Community Services shall 22 provide research, clerical and computer assistance to 23 the commission and give unrestricted access to their records, rules, policies and data, except for those 24 25 items which they are legally obligated to keep confi-26 dential.

4. Procedure of per diem. The commission shall hold an organizational meeting, called by the Chairman of the Legislative Council, within 30 days of the effective date of this Act and shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman at that meeting from any of the members.
