COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 486, L.D.
1314, Bill, "AN ACT to Facilitate Detection of Drivers Operating Under the Influence of Intoxicating Liquor or Drugs."

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§1312-E</u>." in the first line (page 1, line 24 in L.D.) by striking out the underlined word <u>"Mandatory</u>" and inserting in its place the underlined word 'Optional'

16 Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part 17 designated "<u>§1312-E.</u>" in the first paragraph in the 18 first and 2nd lines (page 1, lines 27 and 28 in 19 L.D.) by striking out the underlined word "<u>mandatory</u>" 20 and inserting in its place the underlined word 21 'optional'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§1312-E.</u>" in subsection 1, in the first line (page 1, line 30 in L.D.) by striking out the underlined words "<u>mandated to</u>" and inserting in their place the underlined words 'who may'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§1312-E.</u>" in subsection 1 in the next to the last line (page 2, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the underlined word "<u>shall</u>" and inserting in its place the underlined word '<u>may</u>'

32 Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part 33 designated "<u>§1312-E.</u>" by striking out all of subsec-34 tion 4.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 486, L.D. 1314

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This amendment retains the spirit of the original 3 bill which is to help identify drivers operating un-4 der the influence of liquor or drugs. This amendment 5 makes the reporting by emergency room personnel optional, not mandatory. If the physician or other 6 7 treating personnel suspects that the accident victim was operating under the influence, he may relay those suspicions to the police, who may then follow the applicable law and request that a blood test be 8 9 10 11 taken. This reporting is currently barred by the re-12 quirements of maintaining patient confidentiality.
