### SUBCHAPTER III

#### 7 BUSINESS LICENSING AND PERMITTING PROGRAM

#### 8 §7016. Definitions

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As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

- 1. License. "License" means the whole or part of any agency permit, license, certificate, approval, registration, charter or any form or permission required by law, including agency rules, to engage in any activity.
- 2. Master license. "Master license" means the license provided under this subchapter and includes 17 18 19 certification by the appropriate state agencies that 20 the applicant has met the requirements and conditions for all the necessary licenses and permits of the 21 State to engage in a new business or expand a busi-22 23 ness in the State. The various licenses and permits 24 of state agencies shall be included with the master 25 license.

#### 26 §7017. Program; design

The Business Licensing and Permitting Program shall serve to assist owners or prospective owners of new or expanding businesses or persons exploring business opportunities within the State with respect to applications for state licenses and permits required of these businesses. This program shall be designed to:

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1. Respond to requests. Expeditiously respond to written and oral requests for information about 34 35 licenses and permits required for new businesses or 36 37 business expansions;

2. Develop master business application form.
Develop a master business application form for licenses and permits required for a new or expanding business. This master application shall serve as the only required application for any and all state licenses and permits required of the applicant;

- 3. Assist businesses in completion of master application. Assist the applicant in completing the master application form as described in this subchapter and submitting the application to the appropriate agencies which grant the licenses or permits requested;
  - 4. Respond to state agency requests for additional information about the applicant. Respond to state agency requests for additional information about the applicant and serve as the central clearinghouse for information or questions between the applicant and the state agency;
- 5. Delineate and publish directory of business licenses and permits. Delineate and publish a directory or guide of state licenses and permits required for various types of new or expanding businesses. This directory, which shall be updated annually, shall delineate the business licenses and permits by the name of the agency that issues the licenses and permits, by the type of business or industry and by the type of activity involved. The director shall complete the tasks according to the following.
- A. By October 15, 1985, the director shall compile a list of licenses required of a person to engage in various types of business activities.
- B. By January 1, 1986, the director shall publish the directory as defined in subsection 5.
- 34 C. By April 1, 1986, the director shall develop 35 a standard procedure by which various required 36 licenses are issued to businesses.
- D. By July 1, 1986, the director shall implement a master licensing system; and

- 6. Collection and distribution of fees. Develop a procedure by which all application, license and permit fees are collected and forwarded to the appropriate state agencies or deposited with the Treasurer of State in the proper accounts of the various agencies as directed by the Commissioner of Finance and Administration.
- 8 §7018. Program to be promoted

The Director of the State Development Office shall advertise and promote the program throughout the State. The program shall be advertised in the major circulating newspapers in the State to establish public awareness of the program.

- 14 §7019. Report to Governor and Legislature
- The Director of the State Development Office shall report annually to the Governor and Legislature with respect to the progress and effectiveness of this subchapter.
- 19 §7020. Agencies to cooperate

State agencies and departments shall cooperate with and expeditiously respond to the requests of the State Development Office. Each organization required by this subchapter to cooperate with the State Development Office shall, at a minimum, provide the State Development Office with descriptions of licenses and permits issued by each organization, the criteria necessary to qualify for each license or permit granted by the organization, time schedules established by statute or rule for the submission of applications and appeals, the time schedules for agency responses to applications and appeals and any other information requested by the State Development Office or deemed necessary by the Inter-agency Committee on Business Licenses and Permits.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes a one-stop license "shopping" office for persons who need state licenses and permits to engage in a new business or expand an existing business in Maine. By reducing the number of agencies and license permit applications with which a prospective business owner must be concerned, new and expanding business owners will be encouraged to a great extent to develop in Maine. This bill will help Maine attain the "competitive edge" for business growth.

A Business Licensing and Permitting Program is established within the State Development Office to:

- 1. Compile a list of state licenses and permits required of new or expanding businesses in Maine;
- 2. Publish a guide of licenses and permits required for various types of business activities. This guide will be categorized according to agencies, business activities and type of business;
- Establish a master application form to replace multiple applications for several licenses and permits; and
- 4. Establish a master license which would not replace the licensing authority of any state agency, but would include all licenses issued by several agencies.

The program created by this bill will provide assistance to applicants to complete forms and determine the information and evidence required of the applicant to obtain various licenses. All other state agencies are required to cooperate and assist the Director of the State Development Office.

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
