of the fishery, commercial potential and other factors as he deems appropriate. When distributing the juvenile stock produced by the Hatcheries Program, the commissioner shall give first priority to the marine preserves and artificial habitat developed under this subchapter.

7 §6142. Habitat protection

8 The commissioner shall establish a program to 9 identify areas within the coastal waters of the State which are of critical importance to the marine envi-10 ronment. The commissioner may establish marine pre-11 serves in these areas according to criteria that he 12 13 may adopt by rule. These criteria shall include, but not be limited to, biological productivity, the exis-14 15 tence of rare or endangered species habitat, the ex-16 istence of important spawning grounds, the suitability for receipt of juvenile stock produced by the 17 18 Hatcheries Program or other factors which will indi-19 cate that an area is vital in the life cycle of commercially important marine species. The commissioner 20 21 may limit the taking of marine resources in a marine 22 preserve in order to protect the marine environment 23 of a preserve.

24 §6143. Habitat development

25 The commissioner shall establish a program of habitat development. The purpose of the program 26 shall be to identify promising areas for the con-27 struction of habitat, including artificial reefs. 28 Subject to the availability of funds, the commission-29 er may contract for the construction of artificial 30 habitat. The commissioner shall give priority to the construction or development of artificial habitat 31 32 33 which encourages an increase in the populations of 34 commercially important marine species.

35 §6144. Cooperative research

36	There is established within the Sea Grant Program
37	at the University of Maine a program of research to
38	investigate and develop new commercial products from
39	marine resources and to improve the reproductive ca-
40	pabilities and growth rates of commercially important
41	species through genetic research. The university may

enter into cooperative agreements with the Department
 of Marine Resources and other marine sciences labora tories for the conduct of research under this sec tion.

5 §6145. Fisheries extension

6 There is established in the Department of Marine 7 Resources a Bureau of Technology Development and Extension. The purpose of this bureau shall be to pro-8 vide assistance to the fishing industry in the devel-9 opment of advanced fishing technology, the adoption 10 11 and marketing of new products and the implementation 12 of fisheries management and fishing practices that benefit the State. The bureau shall place greatest 13 14 priority on the delivery of direct services to the fishing industry in the field. The bureau shall co-15 16 operate with the University of Maine Sea Grant Pro-17 gram and the Cooperative Extension Program in the de-18 livery of these services.

STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The marine resources of the State hold substantial potential for further economic benefits. To re-16 17 alize this potential, it is essential that the marine fisheries be managed with due concern for their bio-18 In addition, the quality of the 19 logical limits. marine environment, particularly its water quality must 20 21 be protected. The fishing industry itself requires assistance in the development of new fishing technol-22 23 ogy, new products and new marketing strategies. The 24 bill recognizes that stricter enforcement is also vi-25 tal to this effort.

This bill creates a Fisheries Enhancement Program to accomplish these goals. It is intended that the program be funded by the industry itself through an increase in license fees. Existing federal support could be redirected in support of the Fisheries Enhancement Program.

32 It is expected that the Fisheries Enhancement 33 Program within the Department of Marine Resources 34 will complement the financial incentives provided 35 through the Finance Authority of Maine.

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
